### WHAT DOES CHADWICK FEDERAL CREDIT UNION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

<b>Why?</b>	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
<b>What?</b>	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social Security number and transaction or loss history.</li> <li>• account balances and payment history.</li> <li>• Credit scores, credit and or other debt.</li> <li>• checking account information and overdraft history.</li> </ul>

What we do	
How does Chadwick FCU protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We restrict access to nonpublic personal information about you to those employees and service providers who need to know that information to provide products or services to you.
How does Chadwick FCU collect my personal information?	We collect your personal information when, for example, you: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• open an account or apply for a loan.</li> <li>• show your government-issued ID or make a wire transfer, or deposit or withdraw funds.</li> <li>• use your credit or debit card.</li> </ul> We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, and other companies.
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your credit worthiness</li> <li>• Affiliates from using your info to market to you</li> <li>• Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you</li> </ul> State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.
